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5 SEC. 2. MATTERS ADDRESSING DEPARTMENT OF VET-

- 7 (a) Quarterly Briefings.—
- 8 (1) Quarterly briefings required.—Dur-9 ing the first quarter beginning after the date of the 10 enactment of this Act and in each quarter thereafter 11 until the date that is three years after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans 12 13 Affairs shall provide to the appropriate committees 14 of Congress a quarterly briefing, in person, on the 15 budget of the Department of Veterans Affairs and 16 any shortfall the Department may be experiencing.
 - (2) PLANS.—In any case in which the Secretary informs Congress during a briefing under paragraph (1) that the Department is experiencing a shortfall, the Secretary shall, during such briefing, present the plans of the Secretary to address or mitigate the shortfall.

3		(1) Prohibition.—
4		(A) DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-
5		FAIRS.—Subject to paragraph (2), during a pe-
6		riod described in subparagraph (C), the Sec-
7		retary may not provide any bonus or cash
8		award to any employee or officer of the Depart-
9		ment who works in the central office of the De-
10		partment in a Senior Executive Service posi-
11		tion, or a position in another comparable sys-
12		tem for senior-level Government employees, if
13		the Secretary submits to the Committee on Ap-

9	(2) Sunset.—The prohibitions in paragraph
10	(1) shall terminate on the date that is three years
11	after the date of the enactment of this Act.
12	(c) Definitions.—In this section:
13	(1) Appropriate committees of con-
14	GRESS.—The term "appropriate committees of Con-
15	gress" means—
16	(A) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
17	and the Committee on Appropriations of the
18	Senate; and
19	(B) the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
20	and the Committee on Appropriations of the
21	House of Representatives.
22	(2) Senior executive service position.—
23	The term "Senior Executive Service position" has
24	the meaning given such term in section 3132(a) of
25	title 5, United States Code.

1	(3) Shortfall.—The term "shortfall", with
2	respect to a fiscal year, means that the amount of
3	appropriations required by the Department of Vet-
4	erans Affairs for such fiscal year to meet all of the
5	statutory obligations of the Department during that
6	fiscal year exceeds the amount of appropriations re-
7	quested for the Department for that fiscal in the
8	budget of the President submitted pursuant to sec-
9	tion 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code, for
10	that fiscal year.
11	SEC. 3. REPORT ON DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS
12	POSITIONS CREATED SINCE OCTOBER 1, 2022.
13	(a) Report Required.—Not later than one year
14	after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary
15	of Veterans Affairs shall submit to Congress a report on
16	positions of employment created within the Department
17	of Veterans Affairs during the period beginning on Octo-
18	ber 1, 2022, and ending on the date of the enactment of
19	this Act.
20	(b) Contents.—The report submitted pursuant to
21	subsection (a) shall include the following:
22	(1) A description for each position of employ-
23	ment described in subsection (a).
24	(2) For each position described pursuant to
25	paragraph (1), the following:

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1	(A) The job description.
2	(B) The compensation.
3	(C) Bonuses provided.
4	(D) Remote work status.
